UMPIRE'S CORNER: Jack Delivery. Delivery is defined as deliberately



releasing a jack or bowl from the hand. If it accidentally slips from a player's hand the player can start the delivery again (p.8).

The jack must be placed on the centre line of the rink at the same distance from the mat line as it was when it came to rest. The minimum distance for a jack is 21 metres from the mat line (p. 24-25).
