## UMPIRE'S CORNER: Last week's Law 23 on measuring also includes references



to the "30 sec. Rule". This is a simple provision which requires fast action. If a team member responsible for measuring sees that one of his team's bowls has come to rest leaning towards the jack and is likely to fall over naturally, she can ask for the "30 sec Rule" (Laws 23.1 and 23.2) to be applied. This delays measuring for 30 secs. immediately following the moment the final bowl comes to rest. The Law actually requires that the rule be invoked

by the Skip, but as he is down the other end of the rink it is normally accepted that the "Third" can represent the Skip and the application of the Rule is agreed in the head by the two "Thirds".

If the 30 sec Rule is not applied, or if the timed delay has passed, any player may prop or wedge any of his opponent's bowls at any time. Law 23.6.1.

There is then the question of a bowl which falls naturally towards the jack during measuring, long after 30 secs have passed. Law 23.6.3 states that bowls already identified as "counting" and have been removed from the head, will continue to be counted no matter what effect the newly fallen bowl might have had on their relative distance from the jack. Measuring then continues INCLUDING the newly fallen bowl, which may or may not affect the final "count".
